Academic Programs:

The Academies

The Academies at Lutheran High School is a unique curricular concept that is designed for students who desire academic rigor and the opportunity to pursue their passions in a particular academic area. Opportunities for students to personalize the Academy to fit their passions allow students to thrive. Students choose an area of focus interesting to them so they can dive in, learn, and get a head start on their future career. Upon completion of requirements, students earn an "endorsement" on their high school transcript. To complete the requirement of an Academy, students must complete the 4 C's:

- Coursework
- Collaborative Community Experience
- Cross-Academy Curriculum
- Capstone Project

Current Academies include: Art, Business, Lights, Mission and Ministry, Music, and STEM.

Dual Credit Programs

LuHi partners with Colorado Christian University (AP Classes), Grand Canyon University (online classes), and Concordia University Wisconsin (online classes) to provide courses that students may take for dual high school and college credit. College courses taught off campus can be made by arrangement. LuHi works with online schools for students who desire to take a course that is not offered at LuHi during the given school year.

Access (Academic Success)

Access is a class designed to reinforce concepts that are taught in the classroom and is available for students with IEP or 504s. Basic accommodations provided for Access students include, but are not limited to, extra time on tests, preferential seating, assisted notes, and audio textbooks.

Students' schedules are individualized to meet their needs and their abilities. Also, ESL classes are available.

Community: We serve Douglas County and the surrounding South Denver Metro Area with students coming from 50+ different middle schools. We exist to serve and make a greater impact on our community for Christ.
